- Balance between Short-term and Long-term
- Defining the organizational object (organization's value chain), value cycle
- How to deal with Intrapreneurship uncertainty

# Key Risks:

Babylonian Confusion – wasting precious time and energy;

Getting lost in the nitty-grittyness of what we do;

Not moving forward to a more mature stage of CSR/SD.





# **Key Opportunities:**

- Making simple concepts for eco-efficiency
- Picking low-hanging fruits
- Branding/Transparency/Compliance (Methods & Strategies)
- Strong focus on performance-based functions
- 'The <u>use</u> of the <u>function</u>' becoming a concept
- Pushing Legislation
- Learning from Mistakes
- Opportunities for Education (Hard/Soft Skills)
