In addition to gaining first experiences in the scientific community, there is the opportunity to make new contacts for future collaborations. The language of the event is English.

Letter of motivation (English language, 1/2 page; Arial 11pt, line spacing 1.5)

Why are you aiming for an academic career? What are your professional goals? Why are you eligible for the program (e.g. special scientific knowledge and skills, language skills, experience)? What qualifies you personally for an academic career? In which subject area would you like to conduct research or write your master's thesis?

Abstract (English language, 1/2 page; Arial 11pt, line spacing 1.5)

Choice of topic is free: you should present your own research ideas from the health sector. The following points can be used as a guideline:

■ Problem definition

Explain the subject and research questions.

■ Sketch of the current state of research

Briefly present the state of research on the problem described.

■ Own research question(s)

E.g. identify a research gap and specify the research question. In the case of empirical work, the central hypotheses are to be outlined.

■ Method

Briefly describe the planned empirical procedure (data collection, evaluation methods, etc.).

Virtual evening event on 31 August 2021 and 02 September 2021 from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., including breaks

1st evening Presentation of research conducted by the FOM and SUM; Warm-Up; Presentation of the students' research ideas with the help of their own short presentations (3-minute pitches, max. 3-4 slides); exchange and discussion rounds; insights into international research

2nd evening Warm-up; continuation of pitches and discussions; reflection
